Archaeological Policy Statement

GreenStream is conscious of the archaeological sensitivity of its operating sites in Libya (Mellitah) and Italy (Gela) as well as along the route of the sea-line and aims to minimize any possible impact of its activities on archaeological finds made on sites, with the ultimate goal to preserve the archaeological resources and safeguard the historical heritage of the regions in which the Company operates.

The Company complies with all relevant regulations and laws enforced locally and internationally, including the UNESCO Recommendations relevant to protection and conservation of the world archaeological heritage.

All employees and contractors of GreenStream and visitors to GreenStream premises are requested to adhere to this policy either during performing activities for the Company in the operating sites of Mellitah and Gela and during carrying out underwater works to the sea-line connecting the Mellitah and Gela sites.

Furthermore, GreenStream recognizes the protection of archaeological heritage as a duty of all people and, therefore, invites its employees and third parties to take care of historical heritage at all times and in all places and to immediately inform the appropriate Authorities in case of any finds of possible archaeological interest.

Our commitment

- 1. Promote the awareness-building and education of all the personnel and establish responsibility for archaeological issues within organizational line management promoting their greatest possible involvement.
- 2. Adopt a damage prevention strategy identifying risks associated to the Company activities in which earthmoving or intrusive works are made and planning works to facilitate possible remedial actions.
- 3. Cooperate with the appropriate Central and Local Authorities and activate plans with them to preserve any archaeological finds that may be found in the Company sites.

In line with our Management effort the following measures must be implemented, in accordance with local and international requirements, in the event of finds of possible archaeological interest.

- Any finds must be immediately denounced to the appropriate Authorities.
- Any finds must be provided of temporary safeguard and kept where has been found till the appropriate Authorities arrive or recommended action have been taken.
- Whenever safeguard is difficult to be assured, finds may be removed and protected till the appropriate Authorities arrive.
- In the event a group of large archaeological finds being identified, works in the immediate area must be halted till material in situ be examined and recommended action taken.
